

Question: I would like to know the number of people on the official voting list this year in comparison to the last election, by how many has it increased.

Answer: In 2018 we had 1332 on the voting list and in 2022 we have 1366.

Question: And of further concern is the amount of names missing from the voters list and the fact that they have to visit the municipal office that is only open Monday to Thursday to fill out a form to get added to the voters list.

This does not work for people who work or go to school outside of the area.

What is going to be done for this issue?

Register to vote – or confirm you are already on the list – at voterlookup.ca.

The Municipal Property Assessment Corporation (MPAC) is responsible for compiling information from eligible Ontario voters to create a Preliminary List of Electors for municipal and school board elections.

It is the responsibility of each individual who is legally qualified to vote to ensure that they are on the voters list. Again, the above newsletter was sent to **every property owner** in the Municipality in February 2022 giving ample time for individuals to check.

Second: Our voter help center is open Monday to Thursday from 9 to 5 and will be open on October 24, 2022 from 8 a.m. to 8 p.m.

We cannot just add people to the list without EL15 form and proof of ID. To date we have been able to assist everyone who called or came in in-person.
